
# **CALL FOR PAPERS**

### Art Deco Rioplatense

Rioplatense describes the culture of a region on both sides of the Rio de la Plata that produces crops and cattle but also tango music, avant garde literature and arts as well as modern architecture and design.

The minimalist landscape of plains and waters of the region inspired the building of modern artifacts that borrowed ideas, images, and materials from different parts of the world to shape eclectic cityscapes.

The Congress will offer an exceptional experience of the Rioplatense Deco World that flourished during the 20's, 30's and 40's by means of tours and visits, lectures and readings, cocktails and events.

### **Congress Theme**

The Congress theme is **Art Deco Melting Pots** in relation with the Congress program that will show on site the Art Deco Rioplatense, a trend that borrowed ideas, images,

and materials from different parts of the world to shape modern eclectic design, architecture and town planning.

The Art Deco era embodied the climax of eclecticism in a context of fast communications, combination of tradition and innovation, integration between industrialization and craftsmanship, intersection of arts and design, intellectual and artistic desacralization of images and secular traditions in composition and ornamentation.

### Papers submissions

Presentations should discuss the transfer of ideas, forms and materials that mixed up and shaped a characteristic regional art deco style or trend in a city or region. Papers that present the interactions of art deco with classicism, modernism and rationalism are also welcomed.

Please note that priority in the selection of papers will go to those that present the conformation of the art deco culture of a city or a region through means of the transfer or the combination of influences, the interconnection of disciplines and the hybridization of trends.

ICADS encourages submissions from architectural, landscape, and urban historians; museum curators; preservationists; independent scholars; architects; scholars in related fields; and members of Art Deco Societies and partner organizations.

The final format of papers will be a 20-minute oral presentation illustrated by projected illustrations (with a minimum of text) plus a formal paper (or written speech), suitable for publication.

Notification of acceptance of presentations will be August 5, 2019. during the selection process ICADS may contact you by telephone or email to ask you for more information about your submitted abstract.
